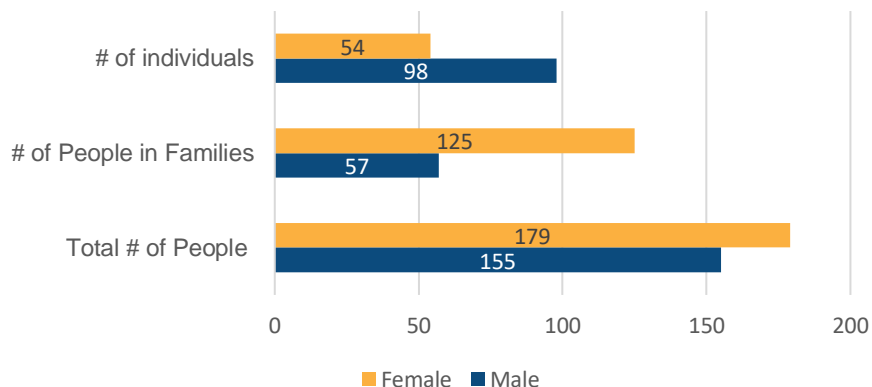
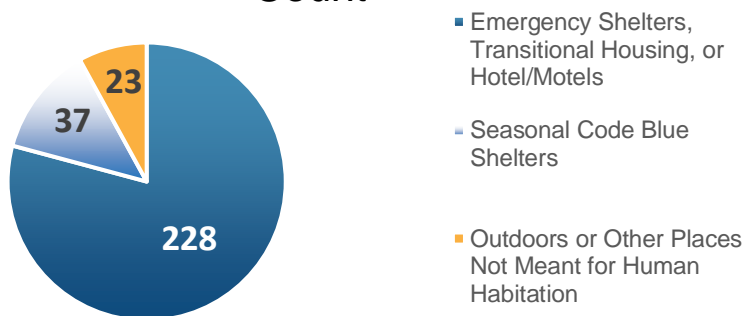


# BUCKS COUNTY POINT IN TIME COUNT 2021 PRELIMINARY RESULTS

On January 27, 2021  
288 people were in emergency shelter, transitional housing, or outdoors in Bucks County. This is a 13.5% decrease from the number of people counted last January.

This includes:

- ⇒ 15 or 5% unaccompanied youth between the ages of 17-24
- ⇒ 23 or 8% Veterans
- ⇒ 16 or 5% victims of domestic violence
- ⇒ 24 or 8% chronically homeless households experiencing long-term or repeated episodes of homelessness
- ⇒ 88 or 30.5% children under the age of 18
- ⇒ 60 or 21% unsheltered or in Code Blue

Point in Time (PIT): a count of sheltered and unsheltered homeless persons on a single night in January.



# BUCKS COUNTY POINT IN TIME COUNT THREE YEAR COMPARISON

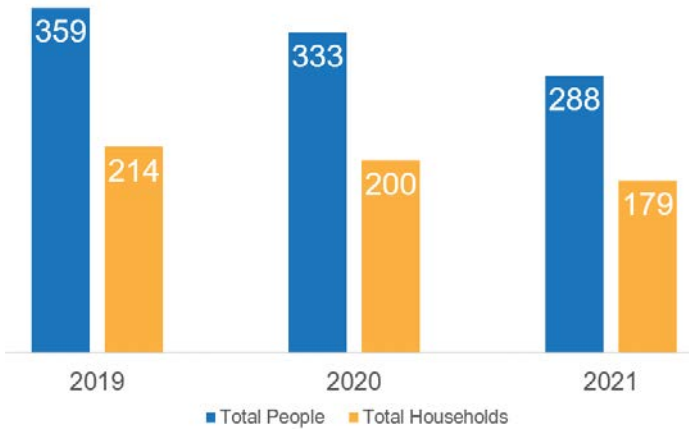


Point in Time (PIT): a count of sheltered and unsheltered homeless persons on a single night in January

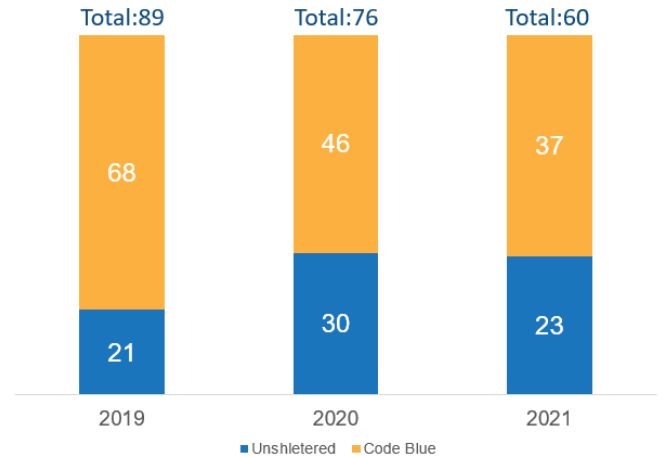
## Summary

The total PIT count has declined over the last three years. There was a 32% decrease of persons who were unsheltered or in a temporary cold weather shelter (Code Blue).

Total Homeless Persons

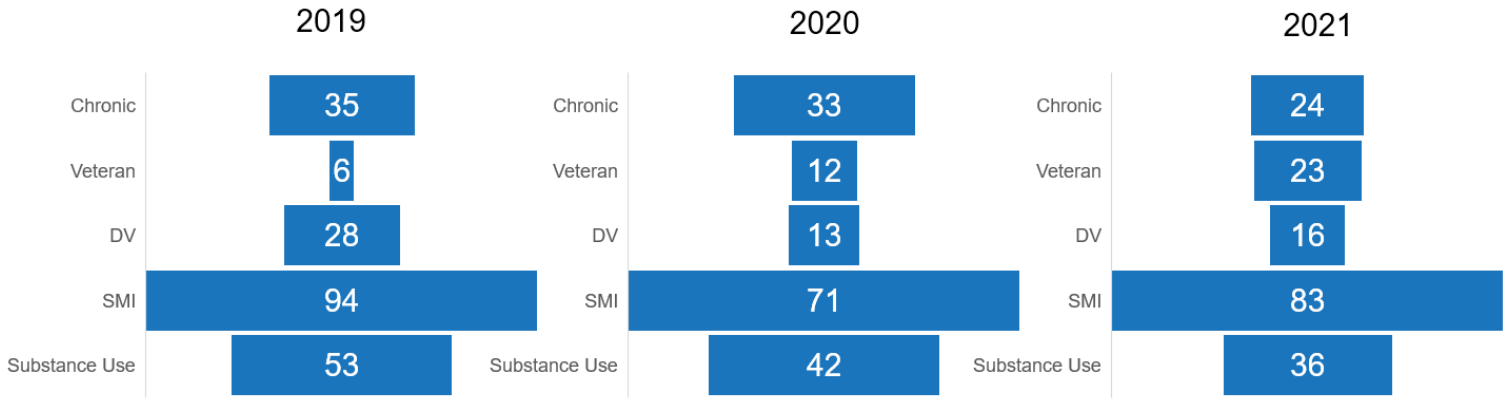


Unsheltered and Code Blue
