2022 Preliminary Results



Point in Time (PIT): a count of sheltered and unsheltered homeless persons on a single night in January

On January 25, 2022

427 people were in emergency shelter, transitional housing, or outdoors in Bucks County. This is a \approx 48% increase from the number of people counted last January.



122 or 29% in hotels. Half of those were in hotel due to flooding or condemnation of housing.



12 or 3% unaccompanied youth under age 25



9 or 2% Veterans



26 or 6% victims of domestic violence



38 or 9% chronically homeless households experiencing long-term or repeated episodes of homelessness



124 or 29% children under the age of 18

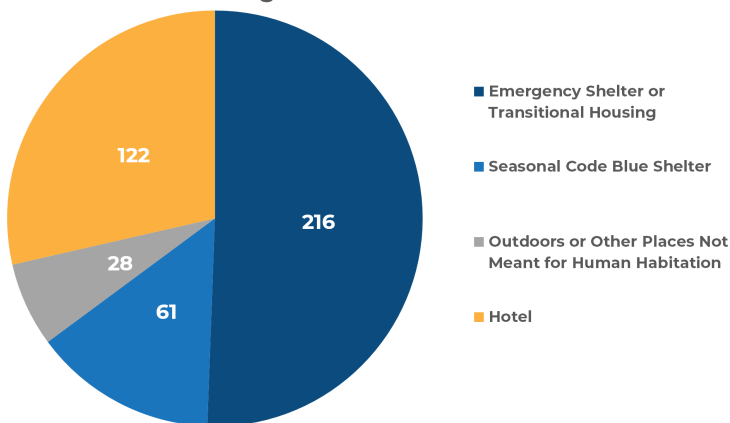


214 or 50% female, 212 or 50% male (<1% other genders)

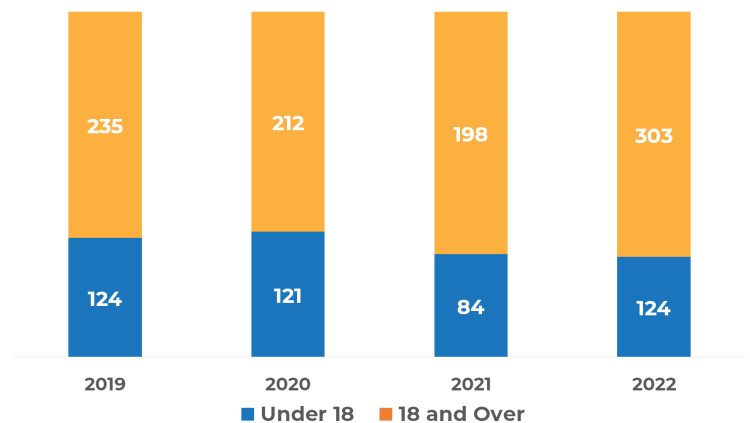


89 or 21% unsheltered or in Code Blue

Adults and Children on the Night of the PIT Count



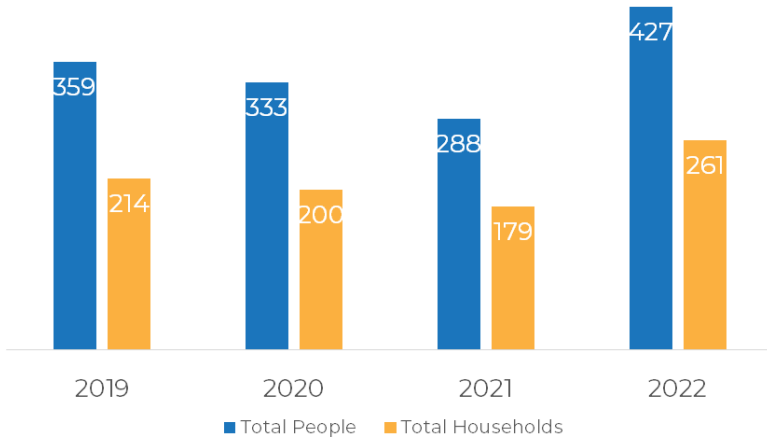

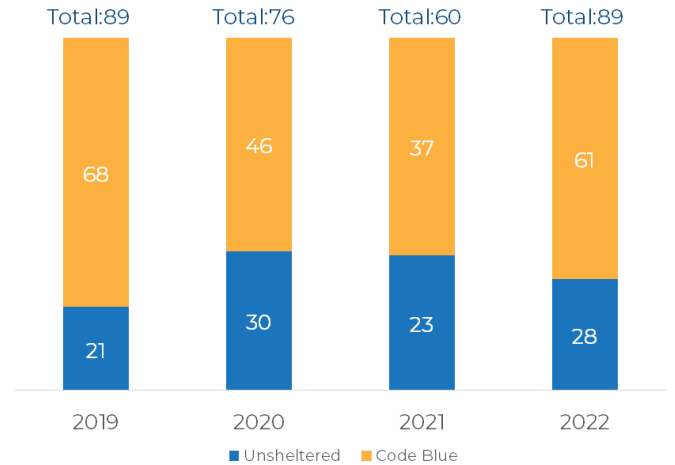
Summary

There was a significant increase in the number of people and households in the 2022 PIT count vs the previous 3 years. Total people increased 19% and total households increased 22% over 2019.

Total Homeless Persons

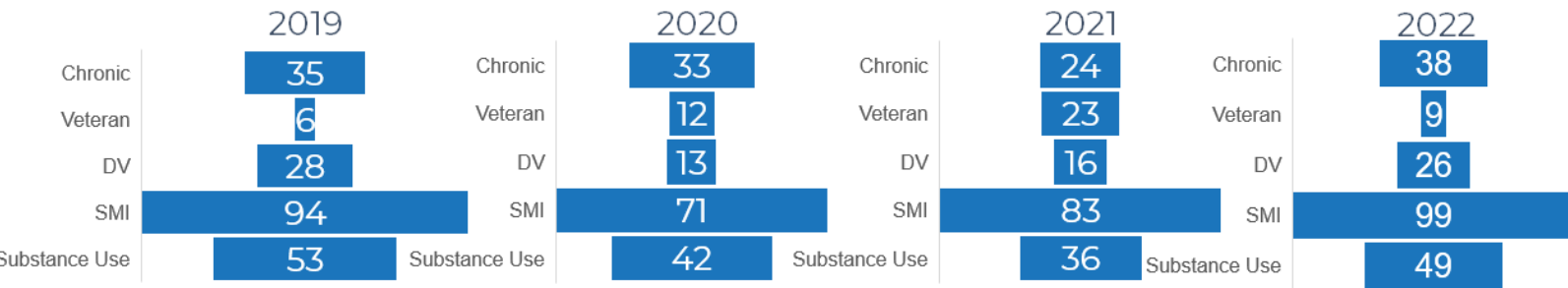


Unsheltered and Code Blue
