2023 Preliminary Results



Point in Time (PIT): a count of sheltered and unsheltered homeless persons on a single night in January

On January 24, 2023

320 people were in emergency shelter, transitional housing, or outdoors in Bucks County. This is a $\approx 25\%$ decrease from the number of people counted last January.



39 or 12% in hotels



42 or 13% chronically homeless households experiencing long-term or repeated episodes of homelessness



13 or 4% unaccompanied youth under age 25



82 or 26% children under the age of 18



7 or 2% Veterans



150 or 48% female, 159 or 51% male, 1% other genders

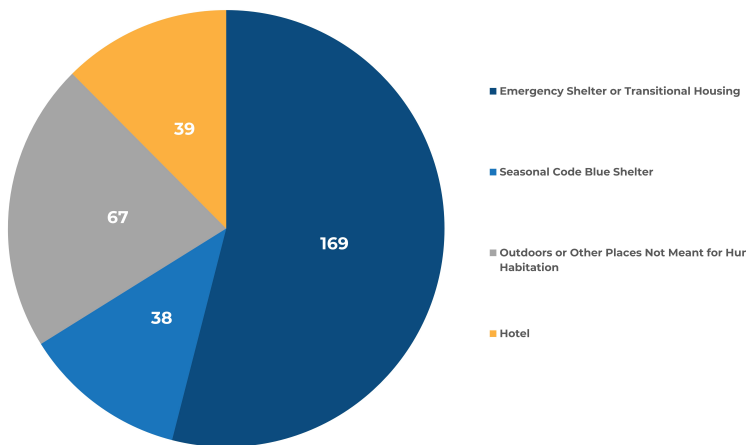


16 or 5% victims of domestic violence

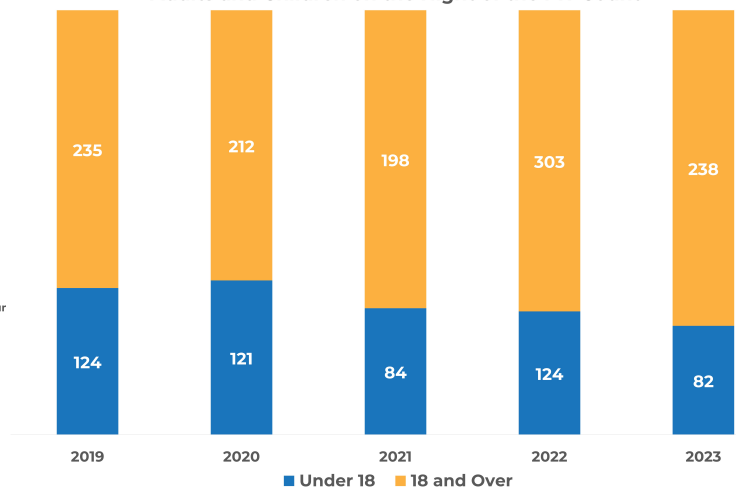


105 or 34% unsheltered or in Code Blue

Adults and Children on the Night of the PIT Count



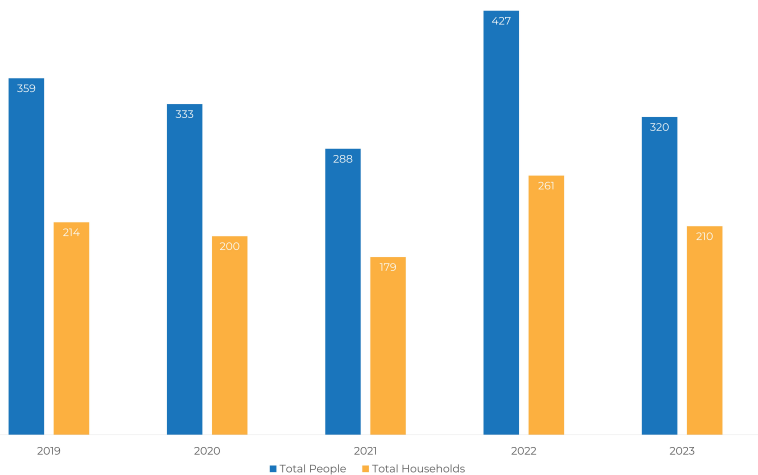

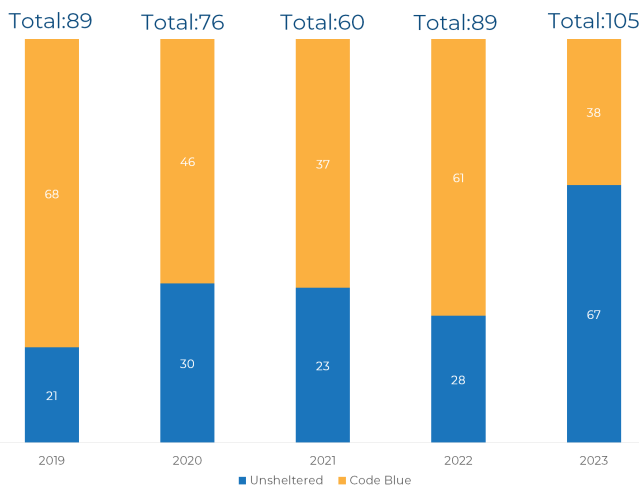
Summary

Total Persons Experiencing Homelessness

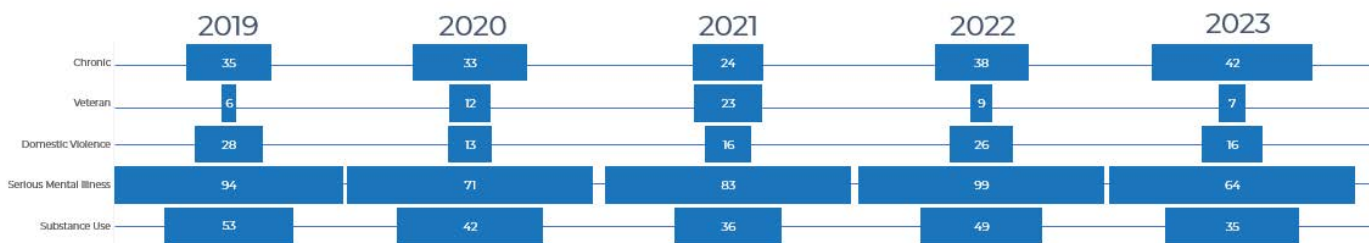


Unsheltered and Code Blue
