### 407 people

were in emergency shelter, transitional housing, or outdoors in Bucks County. This is a **27%** increase from the number of people counted last January

### CHRONICALLY HOMELESS

70

17% of those counted are considered Chronically Homeless. These are people experiencing long-term or repeated episodes of homelessness. There was a 67% increase in those experiencing chronic homelessness



10 or 2% Unaccompanied or parenting youth (18-24 years old)



53 or 13% Seniors age 55 to 61, and 48 or 12% Seniors age 62+



107 or 26% children under the age of 18



233 or 57% were in a shelter. Of those in a shelter, 82 or about 35% were at a Code Blue shelter

Of those in a shelter, 37 or 16% were in a hotel paid for by charity. 41% of those in a hotel were children.



83 or about 20% were in transitional housing for people experiencing homelessness



91 or 22% were outside or another place not meant for habitation. No children were sleeping unsheltered on the night of the PIT Count




Of those sleeping unsheltered, 47 or 52% were sleeping in their car on the night of the PIT count

9 out of every 10 people experiencing unsheltered homelessness on the night of the PIT count last had a physical address that was in Bucks County




## YEAR OVER YEAR DATA

#### Notable Trends


- There was a 65% increase in the number of people sleeping outside or in a Code Blue shelter.
- There was a 66% increase in those reporting a serious mental illness
- There was a 50% increase in people experiencing DV
